Mr Brady,

For the past several years many of us in the greater Springfield area have listened to your insults made against the Catholic Church and its leaders. You have leveled insults against Cardinal Cacciavillan, Cardinal George, Archbishop Gregory, Bishop Lucas, Bishop Kikanas, Bishop Imesch, Monsignor Steffen, Father Schwartz, Monsignor Mank, Father Schmidt, Monsignor Renken, Father Kraft, Monsignor Lantz, Archbishop Dolan, Father Chiola, Cardinal Keehler, Father Harman, Bishop Skylsted, Father Harmon, Archbishop Montalvo, Father Serra, Father Westhoff, Father Titus, Monsignor Kemme, Monsignor Vann, Father Hoefler, Monsignor Holinga, and countless more in our area—not to mention elsewhere. You seem to delight in all this.

Remarkable is the way you omit reference to "some" priests.

Our investigation has brought many to conclude that you yourself are homosexual, as are members of your family. You are uncomfortable with your own sexuality and project your problems on those who lead the Church faithfully. "You protesteth too much!"

We want you to know that our investigation of you, your background, your sources of income, your family and much, much more is only beginning. Every day we learn more and more incredible facts about you. You will hear so much more from us, and so will countless others.

It's not important that you know who we are. You may learn that in time. But, be assured, we know who you are—and are learning more about you by the minute. Watch for us! We are watching you!
